Enlightening documentaries

We have a fascinating collection of documentaries for you this year. Rev your engines ready for Women Behind The Wheel, which follows two young women as they drive the length of the Pamir Highway. Is There Anybody Out There? follows Ella's search to find someone with a body like hers. The struggle of trying to keep the memory of your loved one alive when they themselves are suffering from Alzheimer's disease is illustrated beautifully in The Eternal Memory.

The greatest female composer you've never heard of is revealed to be Fanny: The Other Mendelssohn (below). Fantastic Machine gives an unprecedented insight into the way our relationships with film, TV and phones have undermined as well as enhanced our lives. On The Adamant is the latest film from Nicholas Phillibert, who wowed the world with Être Et Avoir, and observes a boat moored on the Seine in Paris where people with mental health conditions can find safety and comfort.






